In order to make this guide as useful as possible, there are several items relating to the general outline and approach taken to present the information contained in the guide.

- Over the years, the majority of candy packs sold were of a similar design which would periodically change. These we have labeled the "Major Types" and are contained in Section I. Each of these types is first grouped by the country in which they were packed and then listed – generally oldest to newest – and given an ID #.
- In order to eliminate a great amount of repetitive information, reference is often made to a previously listed pack and then the variation from that pack is noted.
- A basic assumption made with the checklist following each type of major candy classification, is that all of the variations came in all flavors. This may or may not be correct. Because of the age and scarcity of the Star A & B type packs, we have added a small "c" to those flavors which have been confirmed. See the notes at the end of the guide to see how you can assist in future updates.
- Many additional packs have been produced by E. Haas Candy and their licensees. These are found in Sections II through V representing chronological order or special types.
- Many flavors have been printed on package wrappers in different languages for different markets. The guide tries to identify those more specifically made for distinct markets. Also, to assist in identifying flavors printed in languages other than English, see the Flavor Translation Chart at the end of the guide.

I MAJOR TYPES

STAR "A" 1950's

Stars on the package face are located **outside the "P" and "Z"** and between the "P" and "E" and "E" and "Z"

A-A 1	<u>\$125+</u>	One face of the pack shows a Box Trademark regular dispenser...both sides have the flavor in German
A-A 2	<u>\$125+</u>	Same as #A-A 1 but the dispenser pictured is one showing a Box Patent type
A-A 3	<u>\$ 75+</u>	Same as #A-A 1 but the dispenser pictured has a regular dispenser, not the Box Trademark or Patent type...packaging on the side has "Made in Austria, Food Factory Ed. Haas, Linz, Mfgr."
A-A 4	<u>\$ 50+</u>	No dispenser shown on the face...the flavor is shown on both sides of the pack in German... no ingredients or weight noted
A-A 5	<u>\$ 50+</u>	Same as #A-A 4 but the flavor is shown in English

- A-A 6 \$ 50+ One side has the packaging information showing "Food Factory, Edward Haas, Linz", the ingredients and the weight as "not more than ½ oz. net"... the opposite side shows the flavor in English...One face has "PEZ is the essence of refreshment, combining the maximum of best refreshing ingredients with minimum of sugar. PEZ really quenches your thirst. Take PEZ from the PEZ-Box the easy hygienic way"

Packaged in US Zone, Germany

- A-G 1 \$100+ Same as #A-A 6, however, the packaging information notes "Made in Germany, US Zone, Unimint, Inc., Munich"... the weight is also the same.

STAR "B" late 1950's – 70's

Stars on the face of the package are located **only between the "P" and "E" and "E" and "Z"**

Note: The **striped Multi-Flavor and Mixed Fruit packs** are not technically Star packs. However, because they were produced during the same time period and also have the same packaging, ingredients and weight formats as the Star packs, they have been included within this section.

Packaged in Austria

- B-A 1 \$ 10 The **flavor** is shown on one side of the pack in **English**...the opposite side has packaging – "Made in Austria" above "Ed. Haas, Vienna – Linz"... **No ingredients or weight** noted
- Note:** A variation of the packaging has "Made in Austria" above "By Ed. Haas GmbH., Vienna-Linz"
- B-A 2 \$ 20+ One face of the pack notes a **mail-in offer** for a **Space gun**...One side has the flavor in English and the other side notes it was "**Made in Austria for Pez-Haas Inc., New York, N.Y.**" along with the ingredients and the weight noted as "not more than 1/2 ounce net."
- B-A 3 \$ 25+ Same as #B-A 2 but the packaging is "Food Factory Ed. Haas, Linz, MFR., Made in Austria"
- B-A 4 \$ 20+ Same as #B-A 2 but the offer is for a **Golden Glow** dispenser
- B-A 5 \$ 15 Same packaging as found on #B-A 2 but does not have an offer
- B-A 6 \$ 10 Same as #B-A 1 except it has the **ingredients** along with packaging "MADE IN AUSTRIA BY ED. HAAS" (all in equal size capital letters)
- B-A 7 \$ 5+ Same as #B-A 6 but packaging is "Made in Austria by Ed. Haas" in lower case letters
- B-A 8 \$ 5+ Same as #B-A 6 except one side contains both the **ingredients and weight (315 oz avoirdupois or 9 gr)** and the packaging is "Made in Austria by Ed. Haas, Vienna/Linz"
- B-A 9 \$ 50 One side of the pack shows the **flavor in Spanish**...the other side has the packaging as "Ed. Haas, Vienna-Linz – Austria", the ingredients are in Spanish and the weight shown is 9g
- B-A 10 \$ 45 A striped multi-flavor pack...One face has a wide yellow band on the left with "Multi-Flavor" and the other face having "Saveurs Assorties"...both faces have "Candy" and "Bonbons" under "PEZ"...one side has the packaging "Fabrique en

Autriche Par Ed. Haas GmbH Vienne/Linz" and the weight as .315 oz avoirdupois or 9g
 Packaged in the **United States**

- B-US 1** \$ 10 The same format as #B-A 7 except the packaging...all lettering for the packaging is in **equal size capital letters** (HAAS FOOD MFG. CORP., ORANGE, **CONN.** U.S.A.)
- B-US 2** \$5-10 Same as #B-US 1 except the side with the packaging information is in **lower case letters** and "Haas Food Mfg. Corp., Orange, Ct., U.S.A." is in bold lettering...the ingredients are somewhat different but not significantly changed and the coloring of the wrapper is less vibrant
- B-US 3** \$5-10 One side of the package has the **flavor and "Candy"** along with "**artificially**" or "**naturally**" flavored plus the **weight (.28 oz)**...The other side has the **packaging information (including a zip code)** and the ingredients

Packaged in Yugoslavia

- B-Y 1** \$ 60+ One side has the **flavor in Slovene** language...other side has packaging information and ingredients
- B-Y 2** \$ 10+ One side shows the flavor and "Candy" above "artificially" or "naturally flavored" and "Net weight: .28 oz"...the other side has "Made in Yugoslavia by Kolinska/Ljubljana" and the ingredients...**All wording in English**
- B-Y 3** \$ 40 A striped Multi-Flavor pack...similar to #B-A 10 except the packaging notes it was made by "KOLINSKA" and the weight is shown on the face of the pack (9g).. the ingredients are noted in English with the same, in French, on the other side

Packaged in West Germany

- B-G 1** \$ 20 Text on the pack is the same as #A-A 4
- B-G 2** \$ 15 One side has the packaging shown as **Unimint GmbH, Munchen, Germany**,...the opposite side has the flavor in **German**...no weight or ingredients noted

Packaged in Spain

- B-P 1** \$ 75+ One side has the flavor in Spanish...Packaging on the other side is "Fabrico en Espana por DULCES Unsue, Pamplona...."

Packaged in Mexico

- B-M 1** \$150+ The face has a small "**HM**" in a circle to the left of "PEZ"...one side has the packaging "Eldorado por chocolates ferback, Toluca, Mexico"...the other side has the flavor - noted in large letters as "Sabor and the flavor in Spanish" below "Pastillas Comprimaidas" in smaller type
- B-M 2** \$150+ Same as #B-M 1 but does not have small "HM" in circle
- B-M 3** \$150+ Same as #B-M 2 but the general coloring is much brighter and the printing contrast is sharper

Packaged ???

- B-X 1** \$ 75+ One face has information in **Arabic** language...both sides have the flavor in English with no packaging information

FRUIT

1970's – early '90s

The fruit packs came in many variations over the span of years they were produced. Generally, the listing below tries to group the packs by their production location and overall graphic layout. When information is noted as being on the face of the pack, it will sometimes flow over to the adjacent side rather than being completely separate.

Also, whether the pack was produced in Austria, Yugoslavia/Slovenia, Hungary, Germany, the US etc., the general graphic layout using fruit was basically the same unless noted.

Packaged in Austria

- F-A 1 \$ 2 The face of the pack has "Candy" & "Bonbons" on the left and the flavor in English above the same in German on the right side – the packaging information "Made in Austria by Nahrmittefabrik Ed. Haas GmbH, 4050 Traun" runs underneath...on the opposite face is "Bonbons" w/**Japanese text** underneath on the left side and the flavor in French on the right...**no ingredients or weight** are noted on the pack
- F-A 2 \$ 1 Printing on the face is much the same as #F-A 1, however, the face with "Bonbons" has the weight (8.5g) – in somewhat larger size - underneath it instead of the Japanese characters...packaging is "PEZ – HAAS – TRAUN/AUSTRIA"
- F-A 3 \$ 1 **All text is on the left side of the package**...No flavor designation shown on the face of the pack...On one side is "Candy" above the flavor in English with the net weight (8.5g) underneath...on the opposite side is "Bonbons" over the flavor in German and the packaging is "PEZ – HAAS - TRAUN/AUSTRIA" underneath
- F-A 4 \$ 40 **An elongated pack** with a distinctive set of multi-color diagonal stripes on the right side of the face having the **flavor in German**... "PEZ" in large letters on the right...packaging is "Hergestellt in Oesterreich, Ed. Haas gesmbh, Linz-St. Martin" (See also #F-G 1)

Packaged in Yugoslavia

- F-Y 1 \$ 3 Same as #F-A 1 with the exception of the packaging information "Made in Yugoslavia by HP Kolinska for Ed. Haas GmbH, 4050 Traun, Austria"
- F-Y 2 \$ 3 All text in English..."Candy" on the left side of package face...one side has the flavor on left...the opposite side has the packaging "Made in Yugoslavia by Kolinska/Ljubljana", ingredients and weight (315 oz avoirdupois or 9 gr)
- F-Y 3 \$ 7 **One face has only the word "PEZ" in large letters – no flavor**...the opposite face has "PEZ" in smaller size above the flavor and "Candy" in English on the left side and the weight (.28 oz) on the right side...One side has the packaging "Made in Yugoslavia by Kolinska, Ljubljana" and the ingredients while the other side shows the flavor and "Candy" above "artificial" or "natural" flavor and the weight again
- F-Y 4 \$ 10 Similar to #F-Y 3 but packaging is "Fabrique en Yugoslavia par HP KOLINSKA"
- F-Y 5 \$ 15 Similar to #F-A 3 with all wording on the left side of package and no flavor shown on the face...One side has the **flavor in Slovene** language

Packaged in Slovenia

- F-S 1 \$ 2 Same as #F-A 1 with the exception of the packaging "Made in Slovenia by KOLINSKA for ED. HAAS GmbH, 4050 Traun, Austria"
- F-S 2 \$ 2 "Candy", in English, on the left side of the package face...side has the flavor in English shown in large print on the left side (? Re: the ingredients and weight being shown)
- F-S 3 \$ 40 Similar to #F-S 2 but has "Caramelle alla frutta" under "PEZ" on the face and the **flavor in Italian** on the side above the ingredients

Packaged in the United States

- F-US 1 \$ 3-5 Same as #F-Y 3 except weight is shown as 8.5g and the packaging is "Haas Food Mfg. Corp., Orange, Ct. 06477"

Packaged in Hungary

- F-H 1 \$ 10 The face on one side is the same as #F-A 1 (having "Candy" and "Bonbons" on the left and the flavor in English above the German spelling on the right)...the opposite **side has the flavor in Hungarian** above "Cukorka" on the left, the weight (8.5g) in the center and the flavor in French on the right side

Packaged in **West Germany**

F-G 1 \$ 30 An elongated size pack...same as #F-A 4, however, this pack was made by **Unimint** (for distribution in Spain)

Packaged in **Spain**

F-P 1 \$ 50 **Not elongated**...Has "PEZ" in large letters on the face with diagonal stripes to the right with the flavor in Spanish...on the side is "Fabrico en Espana por dulces unsue Pamplona, Spain"

Packaged in **Mexico**

F-M 1 \$125+ An interesting transition pack with the face having "PEZ" with stars on both sides of the "E" like a Star B pack but also hav a fruit outlined to the right...one side has "pastillas comprimidas" above "Sabor (and the Flavor)" ...the other side shows the packaging "Eldorado por chocolates ferback, Toluca, Mexico"

Packaged in ???

F-X 1 \$ 50 Similarities to #F-Y 2 & #F-S 2...Has "Candy" under "PEZ" on the left side of the package face...both sides have the flavor in English on the left side with no packaging or weight noted...the opposite face has information in **Arabic language**

Packaged in ???

F-Z 1 \$ 35 **Not elongated**...Similar to #F-G 1 but "PEZ" is in smaller size and also has "Caramelos de Frutas" underneath "PEZ" on the face...the flavors are in Spanish

SMILING FRUIT early 1990's - Current

The smiling fruits also come in many variations. The distinction between this type and the earlier fruit is the fruit now have cartoon-like faces with eyes. The same general format is used to distinguish types as was done with the fruit packs

Packaged in **Austria**

NOTE: SF-A 1, 2 & 3 are foil wrappers, not paper

SF-A 1 \$ 3 **Flavors are in white letters**...no text on face of the packs...one side has "Candy" and flavor in English above "Bonbons" and the flavor in German on the left with "Made in Austria by Ed. Haas Nahrungsmittel GmbH, 4050 Traun" underneath...The opposite side has "Bonbons" and flavor in French above **Japanese characters**...**no ingredients or weight** noted

SF-A 2 \$ 2 No text on the face of the pack...one side has "Candy" and the flavor in English on the left with "Made in Austria by Ed. Haas Nahrungsmittel GmbH, 4050 Traun" underneath...the opposite side has **Japanese characters** on the left and the **weight** (e 8.5g) on the right side

SF-A 3 \$ 1 No text on the face of the packs...one side has "Candy" and the flavor in English above "Bonbons" and the flavor in German

French

on the left with the weight (e 8.5g) in large print on the right side...the opposite side has "Bonbons" and the flavor in above **Spanish** text for candy (Caramelos) and flavor with the packaging "Ed. Haas Nahrungmittel GmbH, 4050 Traun" below

SF-A 4 \$ 2 **All text in English** (none on the face of the packs)...both sides have "Candy" and the flavor on the left...one side has the packaging "PEZ – HAAS – TRAUN/AUSTRIA" below the flavor and the other side has the weight (e 8.5g) placed in the center of the pack and a **bar code on the right** reaching upward into the face of the pack

Packaged in **Slovenia**

SF-S 1 \$ 10 No text on the face of the pack...one side has the flavor in **Slovene language**...the opposite side shows the weight (8.5g/12 kom) and the packaging "Izdeluje KOLINSKA...Ljubljana...licenci ED. HAAS GmbH Linz/Austria"

Packaged in **Hungary**

SF-H 1 \$ 2 No text on the face of the packs...one side has "Bonbons" and the **flavor** on the left **above the ingredients (all in French)** and the packaging information "Prod.-Hungary Janossomorja for Ed. Haas GmbH, 4050 Traun" below...the **opposite side** has "Candy and **the flavor in English** above the ingredients (also English) with the weight (8.5g) on the right side

Note: The peppermint pack has water drops instead of the fruit characters

SF-H 2 \$ 3 **Non-English text**...Flavor on the left side of the package face in **Czech language** with the weight (8.5g) on the right...the opposite face has the flavor on the left (**in Slovak language**) and a **bar code on the right**...One side has the packaging "Hungarocandy, Gyor, Madarsko" on the left and the freshness dates on the right...the opposite side has the ingredients

SF-H 3 \$ 3 **Non-English text**...One face has no text while the other has the flavor in **Hungarian language**...one side has the Packaging "Gyortja: PEZ-HAAS Hungaria Hungarocandy Kft. Janossomorja" and the other has the ingredients and weight (8.5g) on the left with a **bar code** reaching upward into the face of the pack

Note: There have been some slight variations in the listing of ingredients noted on the SF-H 3 packs

U. S. PACKS

late 1970's – Current

About the time changes were made from fruit to smiling fruit packs in Europe, US packaging went a totally different direction. A rather generic look, with no graphics, was produced with only minor change through the end of the '90s

US 1 \$ 10 **Discontinued I:** late 1970's ? –
Made by **Haas Food Mfg. Corp.** - The face shows the flavor and "Candy" with "Net wt.: .29 oz" **on one line** underneath...One side has "artificial" or "natural" flavor with the weight now noted as .29 oz or 8.5g below the flavor which is in large letters...the opposite side has the ingredients (with **food coloring not numbered**) and packaging information showing it made by Haas Food Mfg. Corp.

US 2 \$ 5 **Discontinued II:**
Made by **Pez Candy Inc.** – Same as #US 1 but the ingredients on the side panel show the various **artificial colors using a specific number** and the packaging done by Pez Candy Inc.

US 3 \$ 3 **Discontinued III:** - late '80s
Very similar to #US 1 but the weight on the face of the pack is shown as "Net wt.: .29 oz or 8.5g" and is displayed **on two lines**...One side has the "artificial" or "natural" flavor but no weight is noted...the opposite side has the ingredients (with the **food coloring numbered**) and the packaging information (PEZ Candy, Inc.)

- US 4 \$ 1 **Current:**
 Face is again similar but the weight now shown as **.29 oz (8.5g)**...the sides are the same as #US 3 except the packaging information (PEZ Candy, Inc.) has a **PO Box number for the address** with extended zip code (06477-4021)
- US 5 \$ 3 Another version of #US 4 has the packaging information as "Made in Hungary For/For Nutrition Info Write: PEZ Candy, Inc., P.O. Box 541, Orange, Ct. 06477-4021 USA"...Rest of the pack is the same
 Note: The Assorted Fruit flavor changed from a paper wrapper to a one-piece foil wrapper during the '90s
- US 6 \$ 10 **Sugarfree – Discontinued I**
 Flavor and "Candy" on diagonal slant below "Sugarfree"...one side has the ingredients and "Net wt. .28 oz"...Opposite side has "**Does not promote tooth decay**", the packaging is (Haas Food Mfg. Corp., Orange, Ct. 06477) and the weight is listed again
- US 7 \$ 5 **Sugarfree – Discontinued II**
 Same as #US 6 but the packaging is "PEZ Candy, Inc., Orange, CT 06477"...the weight listed is the same
- US 8 \$ 2 **Sugarfree – Discontinued III**
 Same as #US 6 but the packaging is "PEZ Candy, Inc., Orange, CT 06477" and the weight shown is **.28 oz or 7.9 gr**
- US 9 \$ 1 **Sugarfree – Current**
 Similar to #US 8 but on the side is "**Not for weight control**", and the weight is .28 oz (7.9g)...Also, the packaging is "PEZ Candy, Inc., P.O. **Box 541**, Orange, Ct. **06471-40021 USA**"
- US 10 \$ 10 **Kosher - Discontinued**
 This pack is the same as #US 3 (it only comes in Assorted Flavor) except the side with "natural & artificial" (in much smaller print) notes it is "Made by PEZ CANDY, INC. ESPECIALLY FOR PASKESZ CANDY CO, INC. BROOKLYN, NY 11232 USA" and has a kosher and a Hebrew symbol
- US 11 \$ 3 **Kosher - Current**
 Same as #US 4 with the one side as noted for #US 10
 Note: This pack also changed from a paper wrapper to a one-piece foil wrapper

II LESS COMMON TYPES (1950's-'80s)

of No less important and undoubtedly rarer (for the most part) than the candy packs in the major groups listed, the following types of candy packs are listed in approximate chronological order.

MINI PAKS 1950's – 60's Packaged in **Austria**

See also: #C/E 1, 2 & 3

- LC 1 \$100 Distributed primarily as salesmen's samples or promotions...similar in look to the Star A or B type pack but without the stars...flavor noted on one side in English with "Kostprobe" on the other side

FLAVORS: Lemon Peppermint

LC 2 \$100 A small red colored pack...Face has "haas" above "Traubenzucker"...on one side is "Dextrose" and the other side has "Kostprobe"...no packaging information...also used as a sample pack (See also: #LC 3-7)

TRAUBENZUCKER mid 1960's – late 1980's

"Traubenzucker" is German for 'grape sugar'. There are 3 package versions in a blue background and two with red backgrounds. In addition, there is a Mini-Pak (See #LC 2), an additional blue version in an elongated form (See # E6) and two other elongated multi-colored packs (See #E 5 & #E7)

Packaged in **Austria**

- LC 3 \$ 40 The earliest blue version has "schafft Kraft" on the right side of each package face...one side has "Kraft-reserve fur viele Stunden" and the other having "Traubenzucker"...no weight or ingredients noted
 - LC 4 \$ 30 Similar to #LC 3, another blue type has "Traubenzucker" to the right of "PEZ" on the face...one side panel has "Energie fur viele Stunden"
 - LC 5 \$ 25 Another blue type has only "PEZ" in very large letters on the face...the side has "Traubenzucker" across the entire length of the pack...the opposite side has "Dextrose" with German text underneath...no weight or ingredients noted
 - LC 6 \$ 75+ A red type has "Traubenzucker" under "PEZ" on each face...one side has "Dextrose" in large white letters and the other side has "Traubenzucker"...no packaging, weight or ingredients listed
- Note: The inner candy wrapping is paper - not foil**
- LC 7 \$ 10 Same as #LC 6 but instead of "Traubenzucker" on the side panel it has packaging information "Made in Austria by ED. HAAS GmbH., Vienna – Linz"...no weight or ingredients listed

GOLDEN 1960'S Packaged in **Austria**

LC 8 "Golden" and flavor located on the left end of the package face on a gold colored band...one side has the packaging information "ED. HAAS, VIENNA/LINZ", ingredients and weight (315 oz. Avoir or 9gr)...the opposite side has "The candy that dares to be different"

FLAVORS: Grape Mixed Fruits Peppermint Wild Cherry
 Value: \$ 20 \$ 10 \$ 100+ \$ 100+

"PSYCHO" PACKS 1960'S Packaged in **Austria**

Exemplifying the '60s, these packs look like the decals for the Psychedelic Eye and Flower dispensers in a variable color arrangement

- LC 9 \$ 100 Large "PEZ" on front in yellow color on both faces of the pack...one side has the packaging "Made in Austria by Ed. Haas – Vienna - Linz"
- LC 10 \$ 100 Same as #LC 9 but has "MOD PEZ" on one face
- LC 11 \$ 100 Same as #LC 9 but has "GO GO PEZ" on one face
- LC 12 \$ 100 Similar to #LC 9 but has "PEZ" in orange color on one face and "GO GO PEZ" on the other face

FLAVOR: Flower #LC 9 #LC 10 #LC 11 #LC 12

MOVIE PACK 1960's – '70s Packaged in ?

LC 13 **\$ 125** A double wide pack most commonly sold at movie theaters

FLAVORS: Orange

MAIL-IN OFFERS mid 1960's – early '70s Packaged in ?

LC 14 **\$ 40** A distinctive package showing an offer for a **Personalized regular dispenser** on the face of the package

LC 15 **\$ 40** A second package with an offer for a **Secret Code Flasher** on the face of the pack

TWIN PAKS 1960's or 70's Packaged in **Austria**

This type of package is double in width compared to a usual candy pack

LC 16 **\$ 65** "Candy" on large white blocks on the left side of the face and the flavor to the right...no mention of "Twin Pak" is made on the face...the packaging "ED. HAAS, VIENNAL/LINZ", ingredients and weight (.63 oz avoirdupois or 18 gr) are located on one side with "Open wrapper carefully for exiting premiums" on the other

Note: The premiums offered included the Personalized regular and Secret Code Flasher noted in LC #14 & #15

LC 17 **\$ 75** The face of the pack has the flavor below "PEZ" and above "Twin-Pak" and has "10c" located in the lower right corner

LC 18 **\$100+** Same as #LC 17 but doesn't have the "10c" notation

Note: The Peppermint has a blue background with stars between the "P", "E" & "Z" (like a Star B style pack) and a yellow stripe underneath with the flavor on it. Also, the flavor "Salmiak" is uncertain - possibly a licorice flavor. Reportedly packaged for distribution in Sweden.

SUPER-MINT 1960's or 70's Packaged in **Austria**

LC 19 **\$ 25** A black package with each face having a gold band on the left with "Super" written on it...one side has "Super-Mint" and the other side shows the packaging "ED. HAAS, VIENNA/LINZ", the ingredients and the weight (315 oz. avoirdupois or 9 gr)


SIXO ??? Packaged in West Germany

LC 20 **\$100+** The face has "Sixo" in a white diamond shape...one side has packaging "Unimint GmbH, Munchen, hergestellt in der brd."... the other side has "Traubenzucker"


KNACKY ??? Packaged in West Germany

LC 21 **\$100+** Munchen The face has "Knacky" on a background of red and white diagonal stripes...packaging on the side is "Unimint GmbH, hergestellt in der brd." with "Traubenzucker" on the other side


TOMBO ??? Packaged in West Germany

 LC 22 \$100+ "Tombo" appears in large letters across the face of an orange wrapper...the packaging is "Unimint GmbH, Munchen, hergestellt in der brd."...other side has "Traubenzucker"

HASETEN ??? Packaged in West Germany

 LC 23 \$100+ Name in large block letters on yellow wrapper with a blue X across the face...packaging is "Unimint GmbH, Munchen, hergestellt in der brd." with Traubenzucker" on the other side

HASONI ??? Packaged in West Germany


 LC 24 \$100+ Name set against a red and green background on the face of the pack...the side has "Unimint GmbH, Munchen, hergestellt in der brd."...on the other side is "Traubenzucker"

III ELONGATED PACKS (1950'S-80'S)


During this time period, a number of candy packs were produced by Haas Candy and their licensees which were longer than the normal size pack. The candy in some packages was never meant to be used along with PEZ dispensers. However, many had candy which was compatible with the many other types being produced during the same period. These packs were just longer.

For purposes of organization, several elongated packs are included elsewhere. See specifically Fruit packs under Major Types #F-A 4 & #F-G 1.

SMOKE-PAUSE ??? Packaged in **Austria**

 E 1 \$ 8 "Smoke-Pause" in large letters across the face with "Spearmint . Dextrose . Vitamin C" underneath on one side and the other side noting that "This package contains more than one and a half of minimum daily requirement of vitamin C"...one side lists the ingredients and the packaging "Made in Austria by Ed. Haas" with no weight noted...the opposite said has "Pleasing Breath 10c"

VITA-PEZ 1970's No Packaging location noted

 E 2 \$ 35 Very similar in appearance to SMOKE-PAUSE with "Vita-Pez" in large letters on the face of the pack...one side has "express erfrischer" and the other side has "schlankhaltend"

DOPPEL early 1970's Packaged in **Austria**

E 3 \$ 50 The face has "Doppel" on the left side...one side has the flavor in German with the opposite side having German text...no contents or weight noted

E 4 \$ 40 Same as #E 3 but the flavor on the side is in English

TRAUBENZUCKER

1960's - Late 1980's Packaged in **Austria**

Note: See also #LC 2, 3-8

- E 5 \$ 30 The most colorful Traubenzucker pack from the late '70s-early '80s... has the flavor in German (zitrone) under Traubenzucker" on the face...one side has "schafft frische Energie"

Packaged in **West Germany**

- E 6 \$ 50 Same design on the face of the pack as #LC 5, however, this is an elongated size pack made by **UNIMINT**
- E 7 \$ 40 Same as #E 5 except packaged by **UNIMINT**...the writing is smaller and rounder on the face...one side has "Ed. Haas, Linz" and "traubenzucker bonbons"

TOMBY

1970's

A line of candy caramels in an elongated package

Packaged in **Austria**

- E 8 \$ 60 Basically a plain white package
- E 9 \$ 60 White package with a picture of a caramel
- E 10 \$ 25 Face of the pack has a series of dots fading from dark orange to yellow in color

Packaged in **West Germany**

- E 11 \$ 75 "PEZ" in small letters diagonally on the left side of the package face and "Nufkaramellen" under "Tomby" on the right with two large cocoa? pods in the center...the side has "nufkaramellen" again along with the packaging
- E 12 \$ 50 The same as #E 10 except the packaging is "**Unimint GmbH**"

SUGAR-FREE "HAPPY TOOTH"



- R 1 \$ 7 This pack shows the image of a tooth under an umbrella in a red square on the right side of the package face...one side shows the flavor in German and French...the opposite side has the ingredients in German and the packaging "Made in Austria by Ed. Haas GmbH" (in English)...no weight shown

PEPPERMINT

Packaged in **Slovenia**


 R 2 \$ 7 Package face has several small stars with the flavor in a diagonal “starburst” on the right...one side has the packaging information noting “Kolinska – Ljubljana” and liscensing by “ED. HAAS Gmbh Linz/Avstrija” with the opposite side showing the weight (8.5g/12 kom) and other wording

Packaged in Hungary

 R 3 \$ 10 Similar to #R 2 but the packaging side has “Made by license – haas – austria hungarocandy gyor”...the other side has “Peppermint Candy” with “trademark owner: PEZ Haas Austria” and the weight shown as 8.5g


BORSMENTA

Packaged in Hungary

 R 4 \$ 5 “Borsmenta” printed diagonally across the middle on the right side of the package face with a wavy border on each end...one side has the packaging information and the weight (8.5g)


SUGAR-FREE


Packaged in Hungary

 R 5 \$ 10 Similar in appearance to #R 4...the face has “Light” under “PEZ” on the right side with “Peppermint” running diagonally from the middle to the right...A tooth under an umbrella symbol is on the far left


CHOCOLATE

Packaged in Hungary

 R 6 \$ 15 The entire right side of the wrapper looks like an opened candy bar with chocolate PEZ candies exposed... on the right of each face is “PEZ” with the flavor above (English on one side and Hungarian “Csokis” on the other...each side has the weight
– one side in English (0.3 oz) and the other in Hungarian (8.5g) – and the packaging “Hungarocandy. Janossomorja”


 R 7 \$ 25 The face is the same as #R 6 except “Coko” is used instead of “Csokis” on one face...one side has the packaging showing it produced by “Hungarocandy, Gyor”...other side has the ingredients written in Hungarian...no weight shown on the pack

Packaged in Austria

 R 8 \$ 25 The same as #R 6 & 7 except “Chocolate” appears on both faces of the pack...one side has “PEZ Haas, Austria” and the other side notes the weight as “8.5g”


PEPPERMINT (JAPAN)

Packaged in Austria

 R 9 \$ 2 The face has the flavor in English below Japanese in the middle of the pack with mint leaves on the right... both sides repeat the flavor text shown on the face and one side also has the packaging information below it in English...No weight is noted


COLA 1999

Packaged in Austria


 R 10 \$ 2 Graphic pack with small heads on the far right having the flavor in English superimposed on them...one side shows the flavor in English & Japanese on the left and the weight (e 8.5g) on the right...the opposite side has the packaging “Made in Austria by ED. HAAS Nahrungsmittel GmbH., A-4050 Traun” and the weight noted again

USA 1999

Packaged in Hungary

 R 11 \$ 2 Graphic pack with “USA” superimposed on a US flag...one side has the packaging “PEZ-HAAS Hungaria Hungarocandy Kft., Gyor” and the other side has, in Hungarian, the ingredients and weight (e 8.5g) – above the weight, on the right side, a bar code reaches up into the face of the pack


COLA II 2000 Packaged in Hungary

 R 12 \$ 2 This version of the Cola pack has a new graphic design on the face with an opened soda can (Cola, of course) on the right and "PEZ" on the left...the packaging on the side has "Gyartja prez-Haas Hungaria Hungarocandy kit. Janossomorja, franck"...there is also a bar code which starts on the side and extends into one face of the pack


V COMMERCIAL & EVENTS

Primarily produced in recent years (although there are early examples), the private label candy packs produced for commercial accounts or special events has been gaining in numbers. The late '90s brought an increased variety to the marketplace.


ESSO ??? Packaged in ???

 C/E 1 \$100 Small sized like a Mini-Pak..."PEZ" in large letters on one face of the pack...the other face shows a tiger...on the side is "Esso Extra"


TOUROTEL 1960's or '70s Packaged in Austria

 C/E 2 \$125+ Small sized like a Mini-Pak...One face has "PEZ" and the other "Gute Nicht" (Good Night)...on one side is "Peppermint" and the other has the packaging "Ed. Haas GESMBH, Wien-Linz"...Produced for a hotel in Linz


STROH ??? Packaged in Austria

 C/E 3 \$125+ Another mini sized pack...Produced for a gasoline station in Austria (Stroh)...One face with "Hallo Stroh" and the other has "Hallo Stroh – Gute Fahrt" (Good Drive)...One side with "PEZ Traubenzucker" and the other has the packaging "Nahrungsmittel-fabrik Ed. Haas – Linz"


ROSENBERGER PEPPERMINT Early 1990's No packaging location noted

 C/E 4 \$ 15 Face has "Rosenberger Hotels" in rounded rectangle on the left with "PEZ" on the right...the other face shows the same rectangle but larger...one side has "Peppermint Candy" with the other showing the hotel's address and phone information

ROSENBERGER "VITALITY" Late 1990's No packaging location noted

 C/E 5 \$ 3 Specially made for the Rosenberger Hotels...One face shows the hotel name with "CD Hotels" to the left of it...the other face has "Vitality" with an apple (having a bite out of it) dotting the "i"...one side has the word "Markt" and the other side gives the Hotel address, phone number and fax...no mention of PEZ, the ingredients or weight is found on the pack

SPO (1999) No packaging location noted

 C/E 6 \$ 5 A handout piece (an overwrap on a smiling cherry pack) developed to promote the Social Democratic Party of Austria during the 1999 election for Parliament. One face has "SPO" with "Der richtige Weg fur Osterreich" (the right direction for Austria) written along the bottom and the other face has "V.99"...one side has "das rote Bonbon" while the other side has just the

weight (e 8.5g)

TAB

(1996 or 1997) Packaged in **Austria** (No packaging location noted)

C/E 7 \$ 25+

A private label for a manufacturer of dart boards...Face of pack has graphic design with "Silver Ball" on the right side, "Bonus Candy" in the middle and "TAB Austria" on the right side...one side has a telephone number and the other has an internet site noted...no packaging or weight noted

COLORS: Blue Pink Yellow

Y2K

(1999) Packaged in **Austria**

C/E 8 \$ 5

A distinctive pack given to guests of Lufthansa Airlines at the Munich, Germany airport during a Millenium Party on New Years Eve, December 31, 1999...One face has "Y2K - PARTY" with the other having "with compliments LUFTHANSA"...One side has "FOC-31.12.199-Munich" with the opposite side having the ingredients in German, the packaging "Made in Austria by Ed. Haas Nahrmittel GmbH, A-4050 Traun" and the weight (e 8.5g)

McDONALDS

(2000) Packaged in **Austria**

C/E 9 \$ 3

"PEZ" shown prominently on the left of each face with the McDonald's arch to the right on one face and Ronald McDonald on the other...one side has "...oh, it's orange!" with the ingredients, packaging information and weight (e 8.5g) shown in German on the opposite side
